PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. President, I'd like to explain my vote. For this bill tonight. I simply voted for this bill simply because there are 13 senators that are not here tonight....

PRESIDENT: Senator...hey Senator, you're out of order because there's no issue before this particular Body.

SENATOR KEYES: Point of personal privilege, I can explain my vote.

PRESIDENT: That's fine but you don't talk on a piece of legislation that you just voted on because a point of personal privilege doesn't extend to that. Thank you.

SENATOR KEYES: What did Senator Carpenter talk on?

PRESIDENT: That's a good question.

SENATOR KEYES: Well, it seems that the Chair is a little reluctant on some and more reluctant on others.

PRESIDENT: I don't think that's true. I think I have.... when he jumps up and his light goes on, I have to rule on what he's saying at that particular time.

SENATOR KEYES: A point of personal privilege.

PRESIDENT: State your point, Senator.

SENATOR KEYES: I want to explain my vote on this. I have not voted for a campaign bill all along. I voted for it tonight because there are 13 senators that are not here. And I think they are entitled to Final Reading.

PRESIDENT: Maybe you'd better take your seat, Senator Keyes. We remembered that the Chair was generous. Thank you.

CLERK: Mr. President, a motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion on the desk.

CLERK: I move to return LB678 to....I assume....I've got to kind of reword this...but I assume that it reads to return LB678 to Select File for specific amendment to strike the Chambers amendment. Signed, Senator Stahmer.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President and members of the Body. The same thing might happen to this bill but I would like to point out what we did in adopting Senator Chambers amendment and I don't criticize Senator Chambers for what he did. But I would suggest to you that if you all look at your bill on page 2, LB678, and look under section 1 and on line 3, where it tells now what the law is. Where any county may be resolution of the county board, any city may by ordinance of the mayor and city council, and any village may by ordinance of the chairman of the board of trustees, issue bonds for the construction of roads of the county and street and state
