SENATOR SYAS: Now wait a minute, you can't debate these things but let me just tell you. I don't care what you do. But some of you I understand have a lunch and some of you have Executive Board so I made it 1:45 because it's already 12:20. If you want to change it, okay.

PRESIDENT: No sweat. I have to have one more bill reported back in here. Senator More, turn off Senator Syas' white light when you get there, will you? Not Syas, Senator Stull. Hey, got it, thank you, thank you, sir.

CLERK: Mr. President, clerk reports we have examined and reviewed LB787 and find the same correctly enrolled.

PRESIDENT: Very good. While the Legislature's in session and capable of transacting business, I have signed LB787.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move we recess until 1:45. Signed, Senator Syas.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to recess until 1:45. All those in favor of recessing until 1:45 say aye. Those opposed say no. Ayes have it, so ordered, we're recessed until 1:45.
