

CLERK: Read motion regarding LB692.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy asking unanimous consent to lay LB692 over to when? Just today? Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: If it is any more than today we can all forget it. Yes, just for today.

PRESIDENT: Alright, any further discussion? Are there objections to laying the bill over? Any objections? Any objections to laying 692 over? Hearing none, so ordered. The bill is laid over. Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, I have a point that I think should be brought up and I think that the Senators would take care to listen for just a minute. In speaking to the Governor after I made the earlier statement this morning in which he told me on Monday that it would send the budget bills over he would go to work on them. I then went over to recheck and see if there had been any change and there is no change except that he said that he would have them all here and that is the budget bill that we we send over this morning. All here by 3:00 tomorrow afternoon. So all I am bringing this discussion up for is that the Governor said that if the Legislature chose to work tomorrow we ought to let him know by three O'Clock or somewhere in that vicinity so that he could either tell his staff to work tonight and to stay with it so that he could bring those in by 3:00 tomorrow of the if the legislature chooses not to meet tomorrow and come back some day next week, then he would be able to have that extra time and not have to rush his staff.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers do you have a question of Senator Mahoney?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I have a motion if he doesn't mind.

SENATOR MAHONEY: I have a motion..

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, he has got one.

SENATOR MAHONEY: The motion would be...and we will see what happens out of it, that we meet tomorrow at 3:00.

PRESIDENT: Senator Richendifer, Mr. President....

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: Mr. President, a point of personal privilege. If I had been present, I would have voted aye on LB945.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Warner. Motion before us is that when we adjourn today that we meet at 3:00 tomorrow.

SENATOR WARNER: My question would be to Senator Mahoney. How many hours of Final Reading do we have and how long are you talking about staying today and are we going to run from 3:00 you have got to quit at midnight.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Yes, Mr. President, because of the fact that we have final reading bills that we would have tomorrow we could begin anytime tomorrow but the point that I want
