\$659,000 taken out of instruction and fine arts from the University of Nebraska at Omaha. There is \$726,500 taken out of the University Medical facility. And there is \$50,000 additional in administration for the use of computer which we feel is very important for a total fund of \$2,366,524. I consider this extremely important. I would like to have this body give it serious consideration.

SENATOR KELLY: Yes, supplemental to that, give me a little more on this medical deduction you are talking about..

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: If you will recall last year, the Governor said \$800,000 could be raised from professional fees.. The experience of this year has found that figure was not able to be raised. He has taken \$426,000 ...\$426,500 from this fund, and \$300,000 from the cardiovascular area of the University of Nebraska Medical College for a total of \$726,500.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: O.K. Fine Arts business at the University in Omaha.

SENATOR MARSH: \$250,000.

SENATOR KELLY: Is that the Joslyn Museum..

SENATOR MARSH: He says it is.

SENATOR KELLY: What do we say it is.

SENATOR MARSH: I say that \$250,000 taken from Fine Arts. \$409,000 \$409,540 is taken from their continuation of instruction. Which we feel is defeating the purpose, if you are not even going to fund the continuation how can you have increase of special areas. It's ...really the increases that will be taken out. They will have to have their continuation money.

SENATOR KELLY: Thank you very much, Senator.
