CLERK: That is all I have, Mr. President. I have a motion to adjourn.

PRESIDENT: Could we work the rest of the agenda as a matter of course. Consideration of bills on Select File.

CLERK: None Mr.--

PRESIDENT: Motions to reconsider.

CLERK: None pending, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion to advance bills from Committee.

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Other pending motions.

CLERK: None pending.

PRESIDENT: Unfinished business including messages on President's desk.

CLERK: We have some but we are---

PRESIDENT: And I have none. Consideration of bills on General File.

CLERK: None pending, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Miscellaneous business.

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would like to make a request to change a bill that I introduced. Legislative bill 105 that has been assigned to the Government Committee, have it reassigned to the Banking Committee. Is this the time to do that?

PRESIDENT: Have you discussed the matter with the Reference Committee? Or the Speaker?

SENATOR SAVAGE: We discussed it but we had already referred it and they said we would have to do it on the floor.

PRESIDENT: You are moving to transfer from what Committee to what Committee, Senator.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Government Committee to the Banking Committee. This is a bill that deals with obligation bonds issued by political subdivisions offered for public sale and I think it rightfully belongs in the Banking Committee.

PRESIDENT: Is there a second to the motion? Let's vote a machine vote. It's 25 according to the clerk. Any--

PRESIDENT SAVAGE: Can I ask for unanimous consent? LB 105. Government to Banking.

PRESIDENT: It still takes a machine vote, Senator Savage. I would advise you to go the standard way.

SENATOR SAVAGE: It doesn't make any difference.
