PRESIDENT: The motion is Thursday. Is there any further discussion? Are you ready for the question that argument on the report submitted by Senator Warner and his committee be debated on -- one week from today -- Thursday. We don't have a time certain but it will be during session and I assume that the speaker will work with the people involved to set a time for it. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 19 nays, 3 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Consideration of bills on General File.

CLERK: Mr. President, (Legislative bills read: LB 92). There are committee amendments, Mr. President, by Senator Kennedy's Public Health Committee.

PRESIDENT: Could I recognize Senator Cavanaugh first, his lights been on? Thank you Senator Kennedy. Senator Cavanaugh, for what purpose do you arise sir?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I rise on a point of personal privilege.

PRESIDENT: Would you state the point to the Chair, so the Chair can grant or deny.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: The point regards the Warner report to the Credentials Committee-- certain references made therein to Senator Cavanaugh.

PRESIDENT: The Chair will sustain your right of personal privilege so long as your discussion does not get into the merits of the matter and you are speaking solely of your own right. The Chair sustains your point of personal privilege.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. Chairman, I will address myself under the terms of our rules pertaining to personal privilege, which state that personal privilege shall be first those affecting the rights, dignity and integrity of the Legislature collectively and second, the rights, reputation and conduct of members individually. I rise on this point, regarding the report Senator Warner submitted for the consideration of the Credentials Co -- Select Credentials Committee on the Carpenter - Nichol contest, regarding comments made therein affecting or relating to my conduct before the committee. I have requested the Pages to provide each member

PRESIDENT: State your point of order. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: I believe the remarks which Senator Cavanaugh is making is directed toward the report which the committee made. I do not believe the comments which he has reference to is included in the committee report and more properly would be directed to comments which I personally made. I only state that so that it is clear.

PRESIDENT: The Chair overrules your point of order Senator Warner. Proceed Senator Cavanaugh.
