SENATOR WILTSE: Mr. Chairman, the purpose of the bill is to amend Section 17-801 which now provides that a member of the Board of Public Works shall serve a term of one, two or three years as the governing body directs. Several years ago our statutes were amended to provide all municipal elected officers are elected to serve a term of four years, rather than the previous term of two years. LB 162 will seek to harmonize the statutes and to provide that the Board of Public Works officials will serve for a period of four years similar to that of the
