SENATOR MURPHY: I am making a specific motion the bill be bracketed where it is. I am asking unanimous consent to have it bracketed where it is pending receipt of this information and that the amendment be printed in the Journal. Yes.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yes, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, in response to that, I have no objection to this being held. I agree with Senator Murphy. He asked to have it printed in the Journal. I think it should be. I'll try to get Mr. Nelson to get together with you today, if that's agreeable, and if it can be printed in the Journal for tomorrow, maybe we can take it up tomorrow.

PRESIDENT: Unanimous consent has been asked of the body to bracket 139 for purposes of printing an amendment in the Journal. Do I see any objections to the unanimous consent request? Seeing none, it will be so bracketed. Excuse me, Mr. Clerk. At this time, on behalf of Senator Clark and all the other members of the Nebraska Legislature, we would like to welcome certain students from the Sidney Junior and Senior High Schools. Their sponsors are Tom Cotton and Bill Mitchie and they are in the North balcony. Welcome to the Legislature. We also have 27 students from Merle Beattie here in Lincoln. Senator DeCamp asked that they be introduced and I believe they are in the South balcony and we welcome you students, also. Thank you for coming. We are now on LB 82, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Yes.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the amendments to LB 82.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion of the motion? The question is shall the amendments to LB 82 be adopted. All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary. I am going to order a machine vote. The question is shall the amendments to LB 82 be adopted. Record your vote. This is the E & R amendment only. Have you voted? Record your vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 3 nays, 15 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, we have amending--pending a specific amendment by Senator Duis. Well, I think which amends the Burrows amendment so the Burrows amendment will come up first. The first amendment we have, Mr. President, is offered by Senator Mills. Read. See Page 372, Journal. Signed Senator Mills. No, they were out of order.

PRESIDENT: OK. Senator Mills, do you wish to be heard on your amendment?

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, and members of the body, this is strictly clarification in wording from Emory Burnett and it will read, "except for the first two years of employment under any contract entered into after the effective date of this act."

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, I don't have a copy of these amendments on my desk and I think that on this bill, I think we should have a copy of this amendment before we take it up. Maybe we could pass over it and go on with the others and come back and they could get the amendment out so that we could read
