SENATOR BURBACH: Not exactly. I think I must explain it a little more in detail. Now after the motion has been made the speaker must set this on the agenda sometime within those five days. It does not disrupt, in any way, the idea of bringing forth the bill in X number of days after its been killed by committee, or whatever. It does not change this. It must be completed with the five days for the agenda. The only reason for this is if there happens to be three of those motions, or two resolutions, and it could not be worked into the agenda for that day, it could be spaced; here, again, I say with concurrence of the introducer to visit with him if he wants this on the first, second, or the third day.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp. Any further discussion?  
Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: One quick question. What if there's, on the agenda and you can't get it settled even though you want to . . . happens on the fifth day. For instance, say that the speaker has got this thing all lined up . . . can you break in . . . how do you do it? It's gotta be settled see.

SENATOR BURBACH: This is the safeguard that we can go into the second day, George, or the third day. So if we do not complete a calendar on a day this does not void it. It still is a live action of the legislature. Then it can be carried into the second or third day.

SENATOR SYAS: Well what if this is the fifth day. I want to debate it. The agenda is on General File, say all those bills up there. Noon comes and I can't get in. I can't do it.

SENATOR BURBACH: This doesn't change that George. You still have an opportunity to bring this up. You make your motion on a day and then the following day or within five days it must be on the calendar.

SENATOR SYAS: On the calendar, but what if I can't debate it because of some other things that are ahead of it? That's what I'm getting at. On the calendar, I understand that.

SENATOR BURBACH: I will provide, Senator Syas, a calendar which will permit these things to happen. If we decide that 9 o'clock we go onto our calendar then we so do it in order to get our work done.

SENATOR SYAS: In other words, a person, if the agenda . . . what you're saying . . . if the agenda is such . . . since this has to be done you'll let this in ahead of the agenda.

SENATOR BURBACH: This is right. We'll provide for it by recessing, or getting from General File an hour or two hours sooner, or whatever the case may be.

SENATOR SYAS: OK. I'm satisfied.
