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to strike the enacting clause. That's a specific amendment. In this case, we are not doing that. What Senator Mills has to do, the way I look at it and the way we have always done it, he makes a motion to bring it back to Select File for a specific amendment. He announces what this specific amendment is. Then we debate whether we bring it back for that purpose. You do not amend on Final Reading.

SPEAKER: Senator Savage and Senator Syas, in response to your questions, we are trying to have an amendment so that we can have reasons of bringing it back to Select File. The chair recognizes Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Senator Mills repeated the Schmit amendment. The amendment he is talking about. You have a specific amendment. In fact, you've got two of them.

SPEAKER: The only question before the house is Senator Mills. The chair recognizes Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. Speaker, I merely asked if I could substitute the amendment as presented by Senator Schmit. I didn't suggest we do it. I merely asked. My amendment is specific and the Clerk would read it again, I'd like to act on it and get on.

SPEAKER: The clerk will read.

CLERK: Is this the--I construed your earlier comment to substitute the motion. Are you now on the Schmit motion? That's how I construed your action.

SENATOR MILLS: I asked if I could, I didn't--

CLERK: Did you or did you not, then?

SENATOR MILLS: May I.

CLERK: I thought the earlier chair had ruled that he had already done it.

SPEAKER: I think the presiding officer made a decision and now we have the Schmit amendment substituted by your--

SENATOR MILLS: Right.

SPEAKER: Your amendment substituted by the Schmit amendment.

SENATOR MILLS: I would like to call for the question.

CLERK: The Mills amendment now reads on Page 11, lines 18 and 19, strike "including acquisition of land for aquatic habitat or interest therein,". On page 12, line 2 after "species" insert a period, strike "including, when"; and strike lines 3 to 5. Then it has been amended by the Dickinson amendment, striking on line 17, page 11, the word, strike "shall" and insert "may". Signed Senator Mills.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion? Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: I think that I'd like Senator Loran Schmit to spell out clearer. I am confused and I think rightfully so. You've got to tell me exactly what your words are doing on this thing or else we are moving too fast and then I would have, Mr. President, like Mr. Dickinson to tell me what his one word does here.
