PRESIDENT: Oh, you want it bracketed for a day?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Right, because this opinion is going to take an hour to read and understand. There would be no way you could understand this today. How about Monday? Lay it over to a day uncertain, or . . .

PRESIDENT: The body will not be in session, of course, Monday. Senator DeCamp asked unanimous consent to bracket LB 77. Chair recognizes Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Well as I understand it, Senator DeCamp has asked for it to be bracketed till a day uncertain. I object strenuously. Senator DeCamp asked me about two seconds before he did it the other day to bracket it two days. I agreed to that reluctantly. Senator DeCamp is an attorney. He, apparently, can read legal opinions. I suggest that Senator DeCamp read the darn thing and be done with it.

PRESIDENT: There is an objection. The unanimous consent is denied. Do you care to move Senator DeCamp?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Then I move it be bracketed until next week, Tuesday.

PRESIDENT: There is a motion that LB 77 be bracketed until next Tuesday, whatever date that is. Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Apparently, Senator DeCamp has an Attorney General's opinion. Would he share that opinion with the rest of the body?

PRESIDENT: Based upon Senator DeCamp's statement, Senator Goodrich, the opinion has not been typed and, as I understand it, that's his request for the bracketing, so that this opinion will be ready for the membership. Based upon his statement he has nothing to share. The question is . . . Is there any further discussion of Senator DeCamp's motion? The question is, shall LB 77 be bracketed until the 18th of February. Record your vote. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, 20 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. LB 77 is bracketed until Tuesday. We are now on final reading of LB 22. Read the bill Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Read bill.

PRESIDENT: (mic not activated) . . . record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 9 nays, Mr. President, to go under call.

PRESIDENT: The House is under call. Record your presence. Please record your presence. Senator Goodrich, are you here? Senator Luedtke? Senator Cope, are you here? Senator Keyes, would you indicate your presence. Senator Rumery, would you indicate your presence. Senator Hasebroock, would you indicate your presence. There are two absent and two excused. Are you going to raise the Call of the House? Roll call vote on LB 22.
