SPEAKER: Seeing no objections, so ordered.

LB 227.

CLERK: Read bill.

SPEAKER: Miscellaneous Subjects Committee.

CLERK: There are no committee amendments.

SPEAKER: There are no committee amendments. Senator Schmit is this your bill . . . or Senator Kelly. Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, LB 227 is an amendment in the workmans compensation law, that prohibits employees from suing each other. I move we advance it to E & R initial.

SPEAKER: Any discussion? Seeing none, the question is shall LB 227 be advanced to E & R initial. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, Mr. President, 0 nays.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced. LB 18.

CLERK: Read bill.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Good morning Mr. Speaker. LB 18 provides that the educational opportunities under the state department supervision will be under the State Department of Supervision. Right now . . . in the present law we spell out what the requirements are for instructors of our Driver Education. This will remove the restrictive language in our legislation on our statutes. Only in this one instance does the Legislature deem to tell the State Department of Education what the requirements will be. This has been requested by the Driver Education instructors across the State of Nebraska and by the State Department of Education. I move we advance LB 18 to E & R initial.

SPEAKER: Any discussion? Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Will Senator Marsh yield to a question?

SENATOR MARSH: Certainly.

SENATOR GOODRICH: OK, this is the bill I was thinking it was. I just wanted to check first. In this bill what you're doing Shirley, or Senator Marsh, is mandating that the drivers education shall be . . . skip it. It's the wrong bill.

SPEAKER: Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Mr. Speaker, President . . . a question of Senator Marsh please.
