SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move that LB 20 be

CLERK: Well wait a minute, I have some more motions here. Mr. President, I move to amend LB 20 on page 3, line 6, after "of" strike "two" and insert "one". Signed, Senator Goodrich.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion?

CLERK: Senator Goodrich, your other amendment, did you want it taken up?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Did you want me to explain them now?

PRESIDENT: Would you read the amendment again Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: It's to amend LB 20. On page 3, line 6, after "of" strike "two" and insert "one".

SENATOR GOODRICH: OK, what this does is if this is good for Douglas county it's also good for Lancaster county. It brings Lancaster county in. I move the adoption of this amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: When I talked with Mrs. Dietz and Mrs. Beggs regarding LB 20 and told them about the proposal that Senator Goodrich was proposing to move from 2 to 1, neither one of them said they wanted this. Mrs. Dietz said she couldn't support this bill anyway, even with this amendment. So I move you reject this one.

PRESIDENT: Are you ready for the question? The question is the adoption of the Goodrich . . . Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, it makes absolutely no sense. Lancaster county does not have such a unit. When we do have such a unit we will come in and ask for this kind of an amendment because we would want that. We don't have this unit now. We now work through a special unit in our police department and it does work. Until we get the unit this just makes no sense whatsoever.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Marsh just confirmed not more than two minutes ago that they do have a unit. It is not a separate division like in Douglas county, it's a unit, however, that can function in this way just like Douglas county. Just the fact that it doesn't have a division status doesn't make any difference.

PRESIDENT: Record your vote. Have you voted? Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I ask for call of the House.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Clerk, record this. Senator Goodrich moves that the House be placed under call. Record your vote. Record Mr. Clerk.
