PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: ...motion.

PRESIDENT: Someone who did not vote could.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I'm..I voted on the negative side. To show him that there is compassion down on this end, I move to reconsider for him.

PRESIDENT: There is a motion to reconsider. Any discussion. Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Bear in mind this is a very important issue in the fact that this clarifies the person going along the road at night with the lights on his car, that the way it is now, you could probably be arrested whether you are hunting or not. You are looking for cattle, the way I understand it, so the amendment is the bill and if you don't adopt the amendment, why you have no bill.

PRESIDENT: Permit the chair, Senator Syas, the issue is 26 people did not vote. The question is the reconsideration of the amendment. Record your vote. Record.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I am going to have to, unfortunately, call for a Call of the House to get this over with.

PRESIDENT: The motion to reconsider prevailed.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: OK. In that case, Mr. Chairman, I don't have to call for a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is now up for reconsideration. Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the amendments to LB 220.

PRESIDENT: The question is, the adoption of the amendments. Record your vote. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt.

PRESIDENT: The amendments are adopted. Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, colleagues, I move the advancement of LB 220 to E & R Initial.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion. Record your vote on the motion. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The bill as amended is advanced.

CLERK: LB 157 is a bill introduced by the Public Health and Welfare Committee and signed by the members thereof. Read title. There are Committee amendments by Senator Kennedy's Public Health Committee. Senator Dick Lewis.
