other one. That's the amendment I wanted read. Not the one that is in the Journal.

CLERK: We read the one you gave us here.

SENATOR MARVEL: OK. Did you read the whole thing?

CLERK: Yes.

SENATOR MARVEL: All right. Then I make a motion that this amendment be adopted, and the purpose of the amendment is to restrict the kind of cars that the state can purchase and it says, in effect, that not less than 50% of such passenger cars shall be of the compact class unless the cost to operate and maintain are not to the advantage to the state and then the second section has to do with the political subdivisions. The same thing applies to them. I wanted this read so that the Legislature could be alerted as to what was being done.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion. The question is, the adoption of the Marvel amendment to LB...Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: I wanted to ask a question, is all. 50% being a compact, now I assume, Senator, my question is that law enforcement agencies and those wouldn't be restricted to that or just how...what do you mean.

SENATOR MARVEL: No, no. They are exempt.

SENATOR SYAS: Pardon.

SENATOR MARVEL: They are exempt.

SENATOR SYAS: How about the law department of the Game Department?

SENATOR MARVEL: Senator Keyes, do you want to help me with this. I am looking for it now.

SENATOR SYAS: I am just curious.

SENATOR MARVEL: No, those type of agencies would be exempt, Senator Syas. A good question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR DICKINSON: A question of someone, Mr. Chairman, please. Perhaps I should have read the bill better but how about political subdivisions, what does this include, Senator Marvel or Senator Keyes?

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Dickinson, it would include schools, it will include NRD's, it would include county government, your...let's see...

SENATOR DICKINSON: OK. Then my question would be, can we dictate to counties or school districts as to what kind of cars they buy, with local tax money?

SENATOR KEYES: We can insist that they don't even buy a car, if we really want to do it.

SENATOR DICKINSON: What if many school districts own one
