SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move LB 28 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? The question is the advancement of LB 28, as amended. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The bill, as amended, is advanced.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the Enrollment and Review amendments to LB 66.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? The question is the amendments to LB 66. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The amendments are adopted.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move that LB 66 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? The question is the advancement of LB 66, as amended. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The bill, as amended, is so advanced.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the Enrollment and Review amendments to LB 582.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion of that motion? The question is the adoption of the amendments to LB 582. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The amendments are adopted.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move that LB 582 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Discussion of the motion? The question is the advancement of 582, as amended. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The bill is advanced to E & R final.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move that LB 126 . . .

CLERK: Wait a minute. Mr. President, on LB 126 it was returned for a specific amendment. There are no E & R amendments pending. It's my understanding that Senator Koch now asks unanimous consent to withdraw the amendment that was left pending from yesterday and offer another one.

PRESIDENT: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, members of the body, I request to withdraw the amendment that was pending and to advance LB 126 to E & R final.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? Any objections? Senator Moylan.

SENATOR MOYLAN: Mr. President, I believe it might be in order, in this case where there is no change in 126, to move that LB 126 be sent directly to the Governor, where it was last week . . . not at this stage. Pardon me, I thought maybe if there was no change on it then it could go directly back to the Governor.
