PRESIDENT: The question is, shall LB 24 be indefinitely postponed. Record your vote. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 14 nays, 12 not voting on the motion to indefinitely postpone, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. After the bill is read, it is a majority of those voting. So the motion carries and the bill is indefinitely postponed. Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Just a point of personal privilege.

PRESIDENT: Would you state your point to the chair, please.

SENATOR BARNETT: I sure will. You can't win them all.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Clerk, LB 151 on General File.

CLERK: LB 151 introduced by Senator Nichol of the 48th District. Read title. It was advanced to General File by the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee with no Committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, first of all I would like to move that we advance 155 to E & R Initial. Secondly, I would like to complement Senator Rasmussen on his good report of his committee. 151, excuse me, did I misspeak. I am sorry. This is enabling legislation whereby an industrial area that includes some residential area, the residential area may get itself out of that industrial area. This problem came up recently where a city purchases an industrial area and there were already some private dwellings in that area and they did not wish to be included in the industrial rules under the county plan that is in existence. So this would enable them to be out of this and be restricted only as residential areas within an industrial area.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion? The question is, the advancement of LB 151. Record your vote. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, 23 not voting on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is so advanced. Senator Mahoney has advised the chair that we have several visitor in both balconies. They are in Lincoln to attend the 15th Annual Institute for Labor Union Leaders at the Kellogg Center. We welcome you to the Nebraska Legislature and come again. Thank you for coming.
