SENATOR RASMUSSEN: We have certainly gone far astray from the original bill.

SENATOR WARNER: Yes indeed it has. But I was not aware of the Cavanaugh amendment.

PRESIDENT: Are you ready for the question? The question is, Senator Syas motion to return LB 377...Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, members of the body, I rise to move that we reconsider our action on the amendments to LB 377. I'd like to get the bill back in its original state so once again we can speak to a specific amendment. I just feel that we have heard this bill and if the body wants to discuss the amendments of Senator Cavanaugh and Senator Warner, let them do it here. I oppose sending it back to Committee. That's why I asked for this reconsideration, to strike the amendments.

PRESIDENT: If the chair may be permitted, if the bill goes back to Committee for another...this motion carries, that Committee can bring it back to the Legislature in any form it chooses. I think as a matter of priority of motions that we have to take the motion to recommit first.

SENATOR KOCH: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis, for what purpose?

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I just wanted to find out if this was the motion to recommit the bill as amended or as in its original form. They didn't state in the motion.

PRESIDENT: It has to be as amended because that is the present status of the bill.

SENATOR DUIS: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Again, the question is, and debate has closed, that LB 377 as presently amended be referred back to the Government Committee for purposes of further public hearing. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 10 nays, remainder not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. On General File, Mr. Clerk. LB 112.

CLERK: LB 112 introduced by Senator Warner of the 25th District. Read title. The bill was referred to the Public Works Committee and was advanced to General File with amendments. Signed by Senator Kremer, Chairman, Public Works Committee.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move adoption of the Committee amendment. All the Committee amendment is there was an error in one section. It read 85, should have been changed to 95 to be consistent with the rest of the bill and it is not anything more than that.
