PRESIDENT: Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, members of the body, I visited with the introducer of the bill, Senator Kelly. This is a word that I think, and he agreed, that it makes it much clearer as to the placing of people that go from the institution, perhaps out to the Senators scattered throughout the state. I would ask that the bill be returned so we can put this amendment on.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, colleagues, I agree with this word, it's placement, along with transfer. Transfer may not cover the whole gamma and placement certainly will help the bill.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The question is shall LB 206 be returned to Select File for specific amendment. Record your vote. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The bill is returned. Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, members of the body, I would ask for the adoption of this amendment and to send it on to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Rasmussen's amendment to 206. Any further discussion? Record your vote. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on motion to adopt.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, I would move that LB 206 be advanced to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT: The question is the advancement of LB 206, as amended. All in favor say aye. Contrary. The motion is adopted and the bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Barnett asked unanimous consent to print some amendments in the Journal to LB 422.

PRESIDENT: There is a request for unanimous consent by Senator Barnett. Are there objections? Seeing none, it is so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Miscellaneous Subjects to whom was referred LB 215 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature with the recommendation that it be advanced to General File as amended. Signed, Senator Anderson, Chairman.
