PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, it is now 11:20 and our time to leave was 11:15. I would suggest that the attorneys visit about this over the noon hour and after lunch we can continue debate, or else lay the bill over, one or the other. So Mr. Clerk, would you take up LB 126, Senator Barnett's bill.

CLERK: Read title of LB 126.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: I'm not going to spend a lot of time on this reconsideration because it's been reconsidered two or three times. It's Senator Moylan's bill. I would like to, at this time, suggest that we do reconsider our action on 126. If Senator Moylan has anything to offer as far as amendments or anything else let him bring that up, but right now I'd just say in the defense of the bill that we've only missed by one or two votes here every time. Always, every-time three or four people have been absent. I don't know, we're going to try today. That's it. If it makes it, OK, if it don't Senator Moylan says we'll flush it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Moylan wish to be recognizes?

SENATOR MOYLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I appreciate Senator Barnett's office on this bill. I have had several members state to me that if it was reintroduced in the original form, they would support the bill. I'm going to ask that Senator Barnett's request be honored, that we reconsider our situation. I will offer an amendment to strike all amendments to the bill and leave it in its original form.

PRESIDENT: No further discussion. The question is the reconsideration of LB 126. This failed to pass by constitutional majority on Final Reading. It takes 30 votes to reconsider. Record your vote. Have all members voted? Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 17 nays, 12 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I want to apologize for an error on the daily calendar. I overlooked LB 225, a bill of Senator Kelly's which should be considered at this time. I overlooked it and did not put it on the calendar.

PRESIDENT: Well when we broke from General File we were right in the midst of 288. The Journal might be more readable if we dispose of 288. Nothing was done with it when we left General File. Senator Burbach, the Chair would like to proceed with 288 to some sort of disposition.

SENATOR BURBACH: Well we can, either after completion of our calendar, or we can do it this afternoon. We always leave at 11:15 sir, or at a designated time.
