SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move that LB 341 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

CLERK: No. Mr. President, 341 was returned to Select File for a specific amendment and Senator Carsten has now asked that the specific amendment be laid over one more day.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection to that request for unanimous consent to lay over 341 one more day? Seeing none it's so ordered. Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: I move that . . . you want to move the bill?

PRESIDENT: No, it's been laid over one day. 255.

CLERK: No. We have a request to unbracket 226 and advance it. Signed, Senator Kime.

PRESIDENT: 226? Chair recognizes Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, I had that bracketed yesterday. Senator Goodrich and I have been working on some amendments. We haven't got them ready yet. I ask just to have it bracketed.

PRESIDENT: There's been a request for unanimous consent to bracket 226.

CLERK: No, the request is to unbracket it, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney, did you want to unbracket it?

CLERK: No, Senator Kime is asking unanimous consent to unbracket it.

PRESIDENT: Oh, alright. There is an objection to it Senator Kime. There's an objection to your request for unanimous consent.

SENATOR KIME: Mr. President, members of this body, this was bracketed yesterday without my knowledge or consent. I'd like to . . . at the present time I'm asking for this to be unbracketed so it'd go on . . .

PRESIDENT: There's a motion now to unbracket 226. Any further discussion? Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, I ask the Legislature here before we went into recess to give me some additional time. At that time I wasn't able to put together the amendment that I have to propose. Senator Goodrich and I were working on it yesterday. Rather than put the amendment out and have it done in a fashion . . . the bill has been going across so rapidly we can't seem to stop it. I would like to ask the indulgence of the Legislature to give us five days. We're over now to the last part of the engrossing. If it was back over on General File I wouldn't object. I do have an amendment, I will propose it. I want to be sure that I have all the research done on this. I think Senator Kime can wait. We still will have plenty of time to pass this bill.
