PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Kime

SENATOR KIME: Mr. Chairman, I have never been consulted about any amendment. The bill has been here on General File for some time. It is one of the bills that's been put in for about two months. They have had plenty of time for any kind of an amendment. This is simply a housekeeping bill for the rural electric people in the State of Nebraska. It just governs nearly every corner of the state. It does no harm to anybody, it does a lot of good for the rural electric people in Nebraska. This is my bill. I don't want it stopped. Of course, it's going across because it's a good bill. There's nothing wrong with it. I'd like to have it unbracketed so it can move on.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall LB 226 be unbracketed. Record your vote. Please vote. Have all of you voted? Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 21 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails.

CLERK: (mic inactivated) . . . there will be an executive session of the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee on Thursday, April 3rd, at 12:30 p.m. in Room 1019. Signed, Senator Anderson.

PRESIDENT: We move off of Select File. We'll go to General File now. At the time of adjournment yesterday we had under debate Senator Kelly's amendment to LB 430. Would you please indicate by your light anyone who wishes to be heard on this matter now.

CLERK: Mr. President, the title to LB 430 was read yesterday. It's a bill for an act relating to taxation. To exempt food and food products intended for human consumption from the sales and use tax. There were no committee amendments. There is pending the amendment offered by Senator Kelly which was printed in the Journal and is found on page 929 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Swigart.

SENATOR SWIGART: Mr. President, is this speaking on 430, or is there an amendment?

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly's amendment, which as I understand it, gives \$15 to everybody in the State of Nebraska.

SENATOR SWIGART: Yes. So are we discussing the amendment or the bill?

PRESIDENT: The amendment.

SENATOR SWIGART: I prefer to wait and be heard on the bill.

PRESIDENT: Alright. You were heard yesterday on the bill.

SENATOR SWIGART: Right. Thank you.
