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merely provides a vehicle whereby the funding is going to be available and we are going to spend a couple of hundred thousand dollars here if it meets with the approval of this body and the committee who drafted the bill worked with Mr. Hull, and Mr. Hull has no scruples about this. He is not worried about direction and if you have any particular doubts about it, I'm sure that he would be glad to reassure you and as far as I am concerned, I can see no reason why this legislature should not be concerned about it, but I am sure that you and I have a difference of opinion in that area and that would not be the first or last time, that is for sure.

SENATOR BARNETT: I assure you that is the truth. That is why I go along with this second section and when I point the question that it states in there that such programs shall appear in the Nebraska Educational Television Network, and if that isn't the Legislature taking over and dictating to the ETV people what programs to put on the air, then and you will probably agree with this statement, that I do not understand the language in section two and...

PRESIDENT: Is that a question Senator?

SENATOR BARNETT: No, that is not. I am allowed to make that statement aren't I?

PRESIDENT: Yes, certainly. I'm just trying to figure out if we are having debate or questions.

SENATOR BARNETT: No, I'm watching that, because I got caught on that this morning. I think that you have answered my question Senator Schmit so I have to oppose the bill because I think that the Legislature is stepping into governing ETV and starting to tell them what to program and not leaving it up to those people to make the decisions.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, fellow members. I would like to have someone answer some questions for me. What programs and perhaps Senator Schmit is in a position to do so. What programs are now offered on ETV which are helpful to agricultural and farm interest in the state of Nebraska.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Well Senator Marsh, to be perfectly frank with you, I can't recite any to you at this time.

SENATOR MARSH: My second question is, what time would be utilized that is not utilized for programs?

SENATOR SCHMIT: That would be left to the discretion of the ETV people.

SENATOR MARSH: The next question is where in the priority of the University of Nebraska Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources does this program planning and production come?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Did you ask the question if it was a priority of the Institute of Agriculture?
