Senator Cavanaugh voting no on the original proposition. Is that .....

CLERK: Senator Wiltse voting aye, Senator Wiltse had voted aye. Senator Kremer voting no.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nichol votes no. Senator Rasmussen votes no.

CLERK: Stoney votes no. Senator Bereuter votes no. Senator Simpson voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Syas votes no. Everyone...The Clerk advises the Chair that all members are accounted for but one member. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I would ask for a record vote and raise the Call.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the Call be raised. Record your vote.

CLERK: Carsten changing from aye to no.

PRESIDENT: Record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 1 nay to raise the Call.

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised. Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: This is now voting to aye.

PRESIDENT: You can't do it after the Call is raised. Report the vote by record.

CLERK: Voting aye: Senator Burbach, Duis, Hasebroock, Kelly, Kime, Koch, Marsh, Marvel, Rumery, Savage, Schmit, Simpson, and Wiltse. Voting nay: Senators Anderson, Barnett, Bereuter, Burrows, Carsten, Cavanaugh, Cope, Dickinson, Dworak, Fowler, George, Johnson, Kennedy, Keyes, Kremer, Lewis, Lewis, Luedtke, Maresh, Murphy, Rasmussen, Skarda, Stoney, Stull, Swigart, Syas and Warner. Not voting: Senators Chambers, Clark, DeCamp, Fitzgerald, Goodrich, Mahoney, Mills, Moylan. 13 ayes, 28 nays, remainder not voting.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR BARNETT: Question of the Chair.

PRESIDENT: Yes sir.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, would it be in order or not, having voted on the prevailing side, to ask the Body for a purpose to reconsider this LB 367 and let the introducer speak to the bill. Could I do that now?
