CLERK: LB 564. Introduced by the Urban Affairs Committee. Bill read. There is an amendment offered by Senator Barnett to add the emergency clause.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett, could you speak to that now?

SENATOR BARNETT: Yes, I move that we add the emergency clause to LB 564. I don't know if we have enough people here to do it.

PRESIDENT: You only need 25.

SENATOR BARNETT: Okay.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion on the motion? The motion is to add the emergency clause to 564. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay.

PRESIDENT: Motion passes. Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this bill was introduced by the Urban Affairs Committee. It had been suggested as an amendment to another bill. We felt it would be best dealt with as a separate bill. It's a very simple matter. It takes current existing section of statute. It provided for the creation of special assessment districts to build off-street parking. Currently that only applies to first and second class cities. There is a request from the City of Lincoln to include primary class cities. There is only one primary class city in the state and that's Lincoln. Lincoln City Council supports this, the Mayor supports this. There was no opposition testimony at the hearing and the Committee voted unanimously to advance it. I move it be advanced to Select File.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The question is the advancement of LB 564. Record your vote. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, no nays.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Legislative Bill 560. Introduced by the Banking Commerce and Insurance Committee and signed by the members thereof. Bill read. There are no committee amendments or other amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Mr. Chairman, I believe this is a committee bill that was introduced at the request of Senator Duis and was heard by the Judiciary Committee. I would accordingly ask that Senator Duis present the proposal.
