CLERK: 44 ayes, to raise the Call.

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised. Senator Marsh, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, I ask to have LB 20 held where it is until tomorrow.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 14 nays, 10 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The amendment passes. Senator Marsh has a motion to hold the bill over until tomorrow. Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Well, Mr. Speaker, this bill has been kicked around and hashed and amended and reamended. Is there any way that you can get it in the Journal so that we can look it over and find out just what it is doing after all this conglomeration of ideas. I'd like to know once.

PRESIDENT: The Clerk advises that the amendment just came to the Clerk's desk now. There is a motion to hold this matter over until tomorrow.

SENATOR KEYES: That amendment isn't to kill the bill, is it?

PRESIDENT: That is adopted. As the chair understands it, the bill now could be advanced.

SENATOR KEYES: If she can get 25 votes.

PRESIDENT: But Senator Marsh has asked that it be held over until tomorrow. Any further discussion. Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: For the information of the body, if what was told to me verbally is given to me in written form so that it is similar to what was stated, or what was printed by Senator Chambers, I will be the one asking to have the amendment removed tomorrow but I need to see it in writing before the decision is made.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the bill be held over until tomorrow? Record your vote. The chair stands corrected. There was a request for unanimous consent to hold the bill over. Are there objections? Seeing none, it is so ordered. That completes Select File. We now go to General File. The first matter on my agenda is LB 243.

CLERK: LB 243 introduced by Frank Lewis of the 45th District. Read title. The bill was first considered on March 21st. At that time, the Committee amendments, Mr. President, were adopted and the bill was laid over. There are now some new amendments offered by Senator Koch. Read amendment. See Page 1169, Journal.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, members of the body, when the bill first came up for discussion, I had a question regarding the statement binding arbitration and I think that this will clear it up. It becomes a matter on the table to be negotiated
