PRESIDENT: Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, members of the body, on Page 1165 of the Journal, you will find the amendment that I have offered to LB 264. During the hearings that we heard in Public Works Committee, at one time it was brought out that people who do lose their driver's license in the state of Nebraska are not required to show proof of financial responsibility nor liability insurance as the state of Nebraska is actually requiring them to show. This would clarify that. It goes on to the bill that is talking about the amount of proof of financial responsibility, the raising the limits on that. It fits in with that part. I ask the adoption of that amendment. I ask to return it to Select File for that amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: May I ask a question of the chair, please.

PRESIDENT: Yes sir.

SENATOR DUIS: Would the Chair observe the title of the bill and the content of the bill and see if they harmonize? I merely ask that as a question and then I will refrain... there is no need for an answer now but I was wondering if it would be checked please. Well, the title of the bill calls for motor vehicle increase in deposit and then on the inside of the bill, the cash deposit is in reference to financial responsibility, not motor vehicle. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT: Does that satisfy your inquiry? The question is, shall the bill be returned to Select File for amendment. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, Mr. President, on motion to return.

PRESIDENT: The bill is returned. Senator Marsh, Shirley Marsh, in response to your inquiry, it would appear to the Chair that section 3 of LB 335, the Legislature shall not appropriate more than \$25,000 to carry out the provisions of this act. Since it stated in the negative, it provides for no appropriation and it would be the opinion of the Chair that this is not an appropriation bill and does not call into play the 30 vote rule. That terminates Final Reading. We now move to Select File. Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move that LB 20 be advanced to Enrollment and Review for engrossment.

CLERK: Mr. President, yesterday the bill was on Select File for the first time. There were series of amendments... no, there was one amendment, the Cavanaugh amendment, which was adopted. There is now a motion to remove the Cavanaugh amendment adopted 4/8 and paragraph 1 of the Committee amendment of February 18th. Signed Senator Marsh.
