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other programs for senior citizens", this would take care of the problems we are trying to solve. So I would favor the return of the bill, if we would be careful not to strike the provisions that are on the books at the present time, to provide services for the senior citizens.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: I will repeat what I said that I didn't realize until a newspaper man brought me a copy of this article that LB 307 would change the power structure and go back to the original founding fathers. Maybe this is a legitimate project based on the fact that we are almost 200 years old but I am perfectly willing to bring the bill back providing the initial purpose is protected with these additional comments. We have got some bills in here that regulate lobbying and I don't expect, based upon the shield law, for reporters to reveal their sources but I do think that the well-placed lobbyist who saw fit to bypass the Legislature and the first thing I knew about protest was in this newspaper article that came out yesterday. Why doesn't this well-placed lobbyist come to the introducer of the bill and say, in effect, that there is some problems involved. I didn't know I was this uncooperative in refusing to talk to people, including those who want money, but I think in the future that those who lobby hurt themselves and hurt others who do not practice this way, if they will stop hiding behind the bushes and come out and say exactly what is bothering them. I would appreciate that and I am sure that the rest of you would. Now if this bill is really that far sweeping, as far as I am concerned, I am willing to cooperate with the Legislature in having the bill brought back. It probably would be vetoed anyway so we would have to start all over again. With the understanding that the purpose of this, which is a worthy purpose, is protected but I do protest those people who haven't got guts enough to face us directly, that want to go behind the scenes and whoever he or she may be, I hope they get the message.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. Speaker, I call for the question.

SPEAKER: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? Senator Duis, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR DUIS: Well, I thought I had an opportunity to speak again, here. I am allowed two times on something, aren't I?

SPEAKER: Well, the question has been called for and...

SENATOR DUIS: Thank you.

SPEAKER: And there was five hands showing, too, yes. Senator Chambers is challenging the Chair. That is really not in the question. Will those that raised their hands raise them again, please? Is that all right, Senator. All those in favor of debate ceasing, please record your vote. Have you all voted? Motion fails. The next light I have on, Senator Duis, I am sorry, is Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers yields to you, Senator Duis.
