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running from one caucus to the other to caucus on Committee on Committees with one and caucus with Executive Board on the other. So I think this is an excellent idea and I am sure that the intent that Senator Lewis has, this would conform directly with his amendment.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: I would have no objection, Senator Lewis.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, if I can multiply, you have one district, you have twelve Senators in that district. You have another district, fourteen Senators and you have another one with seventeen. Now I don't think we lack that much being reapportioned on somewhat an equal basis. Now I could care less whether we have three districts or four districts. A few years back, I set the thing up. It was my motion that set us up on four districts and it was on a population basis, as near as we could possibly make it, but this is totally unequal. You have District 1 that would have 360,000 people. Another one with 420,000 and the last one with 510,000. Now, I absolutely won't go along with that under any circumstances.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, I think that maybe we can have a solution to this. Of course, Senator Stull, then is objecting to Senator Lewis' amendment to it and the bill itself has taken care of one problem that we were working on and then there was this other amendment. I was hoping, Senator Lewis, that you would withdraw this amendment at this time. We will sit down with Senator Simpson and Senator Stull and Senator Warner and we will figure this out when we get to Select File to see exactly if we want to go further into this thing that you are questioning. Senator Lewis, would it be possible for you, then, to wait on this because it seems that the proposition is really, as Senator Simpson has said, is tied into the statutory laws that we would have to have Emory Burnett do great research in order to present this in the right form and I doubt if we can put it in the right form for the changing of the statutes that says there shall be certain people on the Retirement Committee. Senator Warner questions the Education Commission of the state, which right now we have no problem because we sort of take the Chairman of Education and we put other members on there so that all three congressional representatives are there. Would you mind holding off on that until we got to Select File with it?

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Are you asking me to withdraw my amendment or at least to hold my committee or amendments?

SENATOR MAHONEY: No, if you are not, fine. We can either vote it up or down now but I do see that it is going to create some problems with Senator Warner, Senator Simpson and Senator Stull, all three, throwing in these additional ones. We are going to have problems.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: I recognize it is going to cause some problems and I recognize it is going to take a while to
