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work out some of the amendments that are necessary but I would like to point out that if we are going to be consistent here and I am sure this body wants to be consistent that we should have all the committees composed in this manner and I would be very reluctant to withdraw or even bracket my amendment at this time.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Thank you very much. This, as you probably know, is my committee you are fooling with here and as yet I haven't been asked to sit down with anybody. I haven't been, apparently, since the beginning of this, there has been no reason to confer with us in regard to the committee. Now I realize this all started out because, probably, of an argument that was had on the floor here as to who was going to be Chairman of the Rules Committee and who was going to be Chairman of the Administrative Rules Committee. I think a bit of confusion was there. I don't mind what you do particularly as far as the formation of a committee but I do sincerely believe that if you are going to do this, why pick out one committee out of the bunch and then start to work on it in entirely a different fashion. I sincerely think that it should be worked out and I certainly have no objections. I am very proud of the Administrative Rules and Regulations Committee which we are dealing with here and I think we have done a good job and I will defend that committee to anybody. I hate to see it destroyed. Because of all of the argument that has been had here and the hanging of this bill over the head of the committee, we haven't been able to do proper work during this particular time because we don't really know if we are here or not. We are sort of in a state of suspense. I would certainly hope that, and, of course, I can't ask this, but it seems as though everytime somebody gets together on this, the Chairman of the Administrative Rules Committee who is me is not asked what his thought is. I would hope that sometime this would be done but at the present time, I would ask unanimous consent to bracket this bill on General File until the situation is ironed out between those who are working on it at the present time.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Kelly. Excuse me, were you finished, Senator Duis?

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I was asking for unanimous consent to bracket this on General File until the situation had been resolved.

SPEAKER: Any debate, any discussion on bracketing the bill?

SENATOR KELLY: I would object to unanimous consent and make a few statements.

SPEAKER: Proceed sir.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, my objection is not to bracketing this bill. It is objectionable to me to bracket this bill in the condition that it now is, where we have singled out one committee. Possibly the Lewis amendment is not correct but I believe that it should
