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one of these 4 employees would leave, for example, and the part of the employer contribution that would normally rest with and revert back to the state would, if they left, it would revert back. If in the event, for example, we take care of it this way, we are simply vesting those 4 employees so that they don't lose benefits and we wind up not getting that.

SENATOR MARVEL: What about the non...

SENATOR GOODRICH: On those 4.

SENATOR MARVEL: What about the non-professional employees?

SENATOR GOODRICH: There is no change, you know, in the rate...the amount that we pay, for example, the non-professional employees of the University and the non-professional employees of the state are the same. So there is no change in the non-professional employees.

SENATOR MARVEL: Is this bill on General File now?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Select. Select. I would suggest, Dick, that we could adopt this amendment and then just hold it right here on Select and I will get Steve Kellison to contact you so you get satisfied and then we will unbracket it and send it on.

SENATOR MARVEL: That's fine.

SENATOR GOODRICH: OK.

SENATOR MARVEL: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion. The question is, the adoption of Senator Goodrich's amendment to LB 466? Record your vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Now, Mr. President, can we just leave it set right there?

PRESIDENT: You do not want to advance it.

SENATOR GOODRICH: No, just leave it sit there until I have a chance to have Steve Kellison, the actuary for the Retirement Committee, contact Senator Marvel.

PRESIDENT: Fine. Senator Barnett and Senator Chambers, are you ready now for LB 23? All right. The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, not only will that amendment be divided but the second half will be dropped altogether relating to the death penalty. That is an exercise in futility and there is no need in me wasting the Legislature's time with that this morning but the other part, with reference to the term of years involved, I think, as I said, a spread of from 1 to 50 years is excessive and my amendment seeks to
