CLERK: Read Cavanaugh motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Were going to take politics out of it lets go all the way. Move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall...is your light on Senator Koch? Shall the Cavanaugh amendment to the Maresh amendment be adopted. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 3 ayes, 26 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Senator Maresh, will you close debate.

SENATOR MARESH: Yes, Mr. President. This isn't a big issue with me, but it seems to be a big issue to certain people that have been lobbying this bill. I think that they are trying to kill the bill, and I think to meet them half-ways this is an amendment that they could accept. They move that this be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Question is the adoption of Senator Maresh's amendment. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 10 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Read amendment regarding "E" clause.

PRESIDENT: Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, this amendment should not draw any opposition. This should put the act into effect as soon as it could be organized, and I think that this is important because presently the state is providing \$55,000 for soybean research here at the Ag College and by getting this check off in the fall, it would bring it about earlier. I move that this "E" clause be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Question is the adoption of Senator Maresh's amendment. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: Amendment is adopted. Under the south balcony are some good friends of Senator Marvel and of mine, Mr and Mrs. Dale Holteen. Mrs. Holteen is one of Nebraska's outstanding administrators since she is the Director of the Hastings Regional Center in Hastings. Welcome to the Legislature both of you.

CLERK: Mr. President there is a request by Senator Warner that it be bracketed pending some additional amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Maresh.
