SPEAKER: The Legislature shall come to order. Please record your presence. Have you recorded? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: Quorum present. Mr. President, an Attorney General's opinion under date of April 23, addressed to Senator Syas, opinion number 66, will be inserted in full in the Legislative Journal. Opinion number 67 will be summarized and a brief sent out in the Journal. It's very lengthy. Mr. President, a communication from the Executive office under date of April 23. "We have received engrossed Legislative Bill 253, 264, 318, 320, 374, 470, 475, 509, 427 and 572. These bills were signed by me on April 23 and delivered to the Secretary of State." Motion on your desk, Mr. President. I move that Senator Mills be given a badge and a big club to assist the Sargent at Arms in securing members of the Legislature and holding them in their chairs when the House is under Call. SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Rasmussen.

CLERK: Mr. President, when we quit before lunch, we were on LB 198. The bill had been advanced to E & R for engrossing. There is presently pending a motion. I move the return of 198 to Select File for specific amendments, strike the "\$96.00" and insert "\$108.00." Signed Senator Mahoney.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, with no conversation, I would just like to reestablish, because we're juggling in figures here, I would like the Legislature to attempt to pass it at \$108.00. Yes, I made the motion to return it. The amendment was for \$108.00.

SPEAKER: The question is, shall 198 be returned from General File to Select File for a specific amendment? Record your vote.
