SPEAKER: There has been a Call of the House. Have you all voted? The Chair recognizes Senator Mahoney.

SPEAKER: Have you all recorded your presence. Can we have a report from the Sargent of Arms. The House is under Call, please record your presence. The Chair recognizes Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: I move the Call be raised.

SPEAKER: A motion that the Call be raised. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 21 nays.

SPEAKER: We are under Call. Are there anymore votes? For or against? Senator Stoney voting aye on the original motion. The Chair recognizes Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President, are all the members accounted for now?

SPEAKER: I asked for a report from the Sargent of Arms. Has he delivered it up here yet? They are all here by Senator Murphy. He is on his way to the Chambers. Senator George voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Murphy voting no.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President, I move the Call be raised.

SPEAKER: Senator Warner voting no on the original motion. Motion has been made that the Call be raised. Record vote has been called for.
