it, there's no compensation for the first six months. Is that right?

SENATOR STULL: It's my understanding that there wouldn't be any for the first five months.

SENATOR LEWIS: Now, also, isn't social security, isn't there an offsetting factor for workman's comp by social security? My information says there is.

SENATOR STULL: Yes, I think there's some offset there. You're right.

SENATOR LEWIS: Okay.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion? Senator Mahoney, you may close.

SENATOR MAHONEY: I will close very briefly. Senator Stull, that would be five long months before you would even know if you came under the social security end and the sum of money that you mentioned is \$93.00. With inflation, the economic situation that we have, I'm sure that the amount of money that I have put forward in this amendment would be such a negligible amount that it's barely going to be able to cover some of these expenses and wouldn't even cover the major ones that a family or a head of a household would have with the situation and the problem that he would have in this particular instance of workman's compensation.

SPEAKER: The question is, shall Senator Mahoney's amendment be adopted? Have you all voted? For what purpose do you rise, Senator Mahoney?

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, I don't like to delay this session but if the Clerk has got a count there, are we still missing somebody? Well, Mr. President, I will not push the Legislature on a Call of the House. The people are present here. If they to choose to vote or not to vote, that will be their own discretion.

SPEAKER: Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 19 nays, 7 not voting.

SPEAKER: The motion fails.

CLERK: A motion on your desk, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Clerk to read the motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move to return LB 198 to Select File for specific amendments, strike \$96.00 and insert \$100.00. Signed Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. Speaker, doesn't the bill have to be advanced and brought back?

SPEAKER: The question before the House is, shall LB 198
