SPEAKER: Your point is well taken, Senator Warner, and now we're just waiting a moment. If either one of the two gentlemen want to withdraw their amendment or we'll have to exclude Senator Lewis' amendment.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. Speaker, I think there are people who would rather have the \$100 amendment so I think we should act on this first one. We can always go to the Lewis amendment if it fails.

SPEAKER: Senator Lewis, your amendment is out of order. We must do Senator Maresh's amendment at this time. The question is, the Maresh amendment to LB 198, \$100.00.

CLERK: The motion is to return it.

SPEAKER: Oh, I'm sorry. The motion is to return it. Have you all voted? This is to return the bill. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 14 nays on motion to return.

SPEAKER: The bill is returned. Senator Maresh's motion is now under consideration.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I think this is a good compromise and I think we should have done this a week or ten days ago, whenever this bill was discussed when I had that motion and I hope that this time it carries and the bill will pass. I move that it be adopted.

SPEAKER: No further discussion, the question is, shall the Maresh amendment be adopted? Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 8 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Motion carries. What will we do with the bill? The Chair recognizes Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I move the advancement of LB 198.

SPEAKER: A motion to move 198 to E & R for engrossment. All in favor indicate by the usual sign. Opposed. Motion carried.

CLERK: Motion on your desk.

SPEAKER: The Clerk will read.

CLERK: I move to return LB 198 for a specific amendment, to reinstate section 8 of the original bill. Signed Senator Cavanaugh.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Cavanaugh.
