CLERK: Read title to LB 602. That's all Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney, should we try any more bills? There are a lot of coats going on.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Yes, there's a gentleman here that would like to try 'em. May I ask . . . it's a point from the floor. Senator Murphy, Senator Cavanaugh. I see Senator Kennedy is missing. Shall we be able to take this up for Monday, as far as reference, or could both committees meet jointly on this, or could Senator Cavanaugh join that committee?

SENATOR MURPHY: (mic turned off).

SENATOR MAHONEY: Well we'll have to make . . . the Executive Board will have to meet the Reference Committee immediately after our dismissal this morning. Mr. President, would you go on quickly with the next three bills.

CLERK: Read title to LB 333.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the committee amendments. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the bill is a bill again requested by the Department of Agriculture. It cleans up the language in regard to the consumer protection and the areas of commercial fertilizer. It . . . the documentation and the explanation of the contents of fertilizers sold by commercial companies. There is one more amendment which the committee counsel had drafted, which I can't find right now and which I would like to add on Select File. The amendment that I would like to ask permission to add in Select File as a committee amendment refers to barnyard manure exemption. With . . . it was commonly called the manure amendment in the committee. I don't mean to degrade the work of the Legislature here but I would move the adoption of the amendments as they are printed in the . . . in your book. I ask to add the additional amendment on Select File.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the manure . . . of the Schmit amendment? Senator Bereuter.

SENATOR BEREUTER: Mr. President, colleagues, I just want to take an opportunity to endorse one of the Schmit bills here.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Thank you Senator Bereuter.

PRESIDENT: He would pick the manure amendment wouldn't he! The question is the adoption of the amendment. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted.
