during this fiscal year, I am asking for the return of this bill for the purpose of adding this amendment. I move its return to E & R . . . or Select File for purposes of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Discussion of the motion? The question is the return of the bill to Select File. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, Mr. President, on the motion to return to Select File for the specific amendment.

PRESIDENT: The bill is returned. Propose your amendment, Senator.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Well briefly this amendment, which is found in the Journal, will make a payment of \$100,000 before June 30th of this fiscal year, \$250,00 before July 31st of the next fiscal year, and the balance during the next 1975-76 . . . '76-'77 fiscal year. I move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall the amendment be adopted. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Now I move that the bill be returned to Final Reading.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall the bill be advanced. All those in favor say aye, contrary nay. The bill is advanced to E & R final. Senator Chambers item is next.

CLERK: Mr. President, there was an attempt to override the veto on LB 267, then Senator Chambers moved to reconsider our action, the original action having failed. That motion is now before us.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is it ready to be taken up right now?

PRESIDENT: Yes sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Members of the Legislature, the reason I moved to reconsider that action was because we had 27 votes. We were 3 short. I felt with the coming of additional members to the Legislature today we could get those 3 votes. This bill relates to the distribution of the published rules and regulations of various state departments to law libraries of every county. Now I don't think it's necessary, I hope it isn't, to explain the importance of having these rules available for citizens to explore. Most of you were here yesterday so you heard all of the arguments. Twenty-six of you accepted them. For the other 3 that we need, if you have any questions I'll answer them, but the motion is to pass this bill not withstanding the objections of the Governor.
