PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Goodrich's amendment. Record your vote. Please vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are more amendments on the bill. An amendment offered by Senator Kelly which amends another section and adds to 53-165 dealing with the returns from the manufacturing districution at the wholesale the liquor. (Read amendment found on pages 1587 and 1588 in Journal).

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this amendment is again to the reporting that the liquor dealers do, through the distributors, . . .

PRESIDENT: Excuse me, Senator Kelly. Could we have a little more order in the hall please.

SENATOR KELLY: This amendment is to again, through the distribution of individual and individual business information on their sales volume by types and brands, etc. The amendment that I offered previously would prohibit the commission from printing or distributing the individual businesses names. It appeared that the Legislature would prefer that this is public information and therefore should be absolutely, completely public. The amendment does just that. If those returns and reports will be completely public it does require that the liquor commission will inform or advise each individual business who receives information about their business. The Liquor Commission can still use these for public information. I move the adoption of my amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Kelly's amendment. Record your vote. Please vote. Record. Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, I respectfully request a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall the House go under Call. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 1 nay.
