PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yield to Senator Simpson.

PRESIDENT: Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Wiltse is gone and has a problem on a bill. I wondered if we could cut in and take care of it in that the bill 306 has been passed. It's gone to the Governor's office. This is the last day. He wishes to have it brought back. I would just bring it back to Final Reading for him, if that was possible. There are two words that are a problem.

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes, Senator Simpson does have a time problem. Would you object if debate on this matter was interrupted for this specific purpose?

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, we've debated this bill for an hour today and an hour yesterday. I believe, before some of the Senators get full of understanding of what's going on, including Senator Marvel, and I have some information he'd like. I think we ought to stop debate on this bill now and hear what Senator Simpson has to say for Senator Wiltse and adjourn until Monday morning.

PRESIDENT: Alright. Well I'm not going to take that up right now, but . . . Debate on 123 will be suspended. Chair recognizes Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, on LB 306, which has been passed, it was passed on the 28th. On page 5, line 16 the new wording "or assembled", the Governor would wish a clarification. He talked to Senator Wiltse. Senator Wiltse was willing to bring it back for that clarification so I would ask, as a courtesy to Senator Wiltse, that we might return the bill today and hold it on Final Reading until he comes back, then he could do his own explaining on the amendment from there.

PRESIDENT: The question is . . . I can't tell what lights are on visually. Does anyone wish to speak on this request? The question is shall the Clerk be instructed to request the return of the bill. Record your vote. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review reports we have examined and reviewed LB 417 and recommend it be placed on Select File as amended; 417A Select File as amended.
