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is that you're striking sections 13 and 14. You're leaving in section 15 which adds up to one thing. The 1 mill levy, locally, for capital improvements would still be levied locally. Once they've levied their local 1 mill then they still have to come to the Legislature and ask us if they can spend it. Is that the true intent of your amendment?

SENATOR MARVEL: The intent of the amendment is to leave . . . you're right except that the additional mill is specifically for retirement purposes and not for new construction.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I frankly would have to encourage you to reject the Marvel amendment. If they're going to levy the 1 mill locally I think they should also have the power to spend it locally. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marvel, are you ready to close debate by way of reply?

SENATOR MARVEL: I'll only say one thing. When we keep talking about the lack of confidence in local boards that's not the issue. The issue is that some group of people in this state have to have some kind of perspective on capital construction. That includes all departments of government and not specifically this area. The only body that has this at the moment is the Legislature. I have no pride of authorship in this area. Unless we get a handle on capital construction and specifically in the area of higher education, we are begging for all kinds of problems. That's the only reason for this particular amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the first of Senator Marvel's amendments. Record your vote. Have you voted? Have you voted? Record.

SENATOR MARVEL: Call of the House Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marvel asks that the House be put under Call. Record. Clear the board please. Record. Have you voted on going under Call? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 11 nays.

PRESIDENT: We are under Call. All Senators please take your chairs and record your presence. Would the Sergeant-at-Arms secure the presence of all members.

CLERK: Senator Burrows voting no on the original motion. Senator Mills voting . . . changing from no to aye. Senator Skarda, Mr. President, had asked to be excused earlier.

PRESIDENT: Please take your chairs. Senator Cavanaugh. We're under Call.

CLERK: Senator Maresh voting aye on the original motion. Senator Duis voting aye.
