PRESIDENT: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, members of the body. Is Senator Cavanaugh around?

PRESIDENT: You want to approach Senator Luedtke's microphone, Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR KOCH: Senator Cavanaugh, would you be willing to place this matter in another piece of legislation so we can have a proper discussion of it, rather than doing it here in the last few days of the session?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Senator Koch, the only thing I did was add the legislative approval for gifts of real estate. All the rest of that is in there ... was in there. That's all I amended. I just added the legislatures approval when it entailed real estate over \$10,000. The idea of approval wasn't mine at all. That was in the budget bill.

SENATOR KOCH: Well aren't we legislating on a budget bill which is really not a proper way to do it?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Well we've done it since I've been here. Certainly last years budget bill was a good deal more legislation than this years.

SENATOR KOCH: I think many times this gets lost in the maze of things and probably is not proper. Would you agree?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Senator Koch, if you feel you should strike anything that you don't feel is proper in the budget bill ...

SENATOR KOCH: No, I agree with what you're trying to get to, Senator Cavanaugh. I'm saying that we ought to possibly do it in a distinct piece of legislation that is well thought out of what all the ramifications of it might be.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: The point is, Senator Koch, all I did was add the legislature's approval to real estate. That's all I ... all the rest of the language regarding gifts and bequeaths is already in there. Now if you think none of it should be in there, you're not arguing with me. If it all goes out it really doesn't matter to me. I think if we're going to put that in there that the Legislature should approve gifts and bequests. You should argue with Senator Marvel and not me because all I did was amend what he had in there.

SENATOR KOCH: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich, would you close debate by way of reply on this matter?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes. I would agree with Senator Syas and Senator Marvel that the effect ... frankly I'd rather not do it with my amendment, to give the Exec Board the right to act while we're not in session. It's just that
