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carry out its duties and they could hire anyone they want. It doesn't say who or how many or what...

SENATOR F. LEWIS: That's correct, Senator Clark, just like the Aging Commission, just like the Indian Commission, just like the Mexican Commission, just like a hundred other commissions we have got in the state. The language is the same.

SENATOR CLARK: Would you let me ask you a question?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Sure, I just thought I was answering one.

SENATOR CLARK: Yes, I can read it but it says here that they are going to fix the salary of these people. I don't know how many people. It doesn't say. Reimbursement for all traveling and other expenses.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Well, Senator Clark, is that what concerns you. The logistic controls or the bill itself?

SENATOR CLARK: Well, it looks to me like it makes it a state agency again while you are funding it out of the General Fund.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Well, the Attorney General, and I assume that he knows what is defensible legally, has reviewed the bill. That was in it when we sent it for review. He has told us it is acceptable. Now you may have better legal advice than him or you may be a better lawyer but he says it is defensible and it is legal.

SENATOR CLARK: All I know, he said the last one was constitutional and it was proven to be unconstitutional. I hate to see these schools up in the air all the time and I am afraid that this is what this is going to do. I have an amendment to take the commission out altogether, beings that they have no duties or functions or anything else.

PRESIDENT: Now, are you ready to close on the two propo... close on all paragraphs but #4.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, if it is in order, I would ask unanimous consent to withdraw all parts of it with the exception of 4.

PRESIDENT: It is so ordered.

SENATOR KOCH: Now I will speak to 4, Page 10, line 25. My purpose is that no person shall be eligible to membership on the board who is an elected or appointed member of any other board relating to education and I think that everyone understands this and I think you know my reasons for this and I would hope that the body would see fit to place this into LB 344.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Koch's amendment. Senator Mills, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, I have a question of Senator Koch then.

PRESIDENT: Well, would you direct the question to the Chair?
