PRESIDENT: No it will not sir, this is time now and in two or three days, now it is over here, and were concerned about getting bills off general file.

SENATOR SYAS: I understand that, but how long can you hold them on Select File and still make it?

PRESIDENT: I suppose until next Tuesday, well where it is at now and if you don't bring it back it will probably be, where is it now? I suppose 3 or 4 days at the most but prior to adjournment.

SENATOR SYAS: You could bring it back three days from now and still make final reading?

PRESIDENT: Four days from the adjournment date.

SENATOR SYAS: If it was vetoed, we couldn't override though.

PRESIDENT: Absolutely correct. It must be read no later than Friday evening of this week if you want to have it back for an override of a veto.

SENATOR SYAS: It has to be brought back to Select File and then make Final Reading or you couldn't have the veto.

PRESIDENT: Yes, the next hour or so is very crucial, if you want an opportunity to override a veto. Chair recognizes Senator Swigart.

SENATOR SWIGART: I would like to ask for unanimous approval to bracket it for two days.

PRESIDENT: Is there any objection? Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, the bill is on Final Reading are we talking on Select File or where are we talking now?

PRESIDENT: Were still on Final Reading.

SENATOR KEYES: Were on Final Reading and the bill is going to be bracketed on Final Reading on whose amendment? He can do what he wants to with his amendment as far as I am concerned, and I care not if the bill goes across until the very last day because if the Governor vetoes it I'm certainly not going to support an over ride on it, so as far as I am concerned, I would like to see the bill go ahead and get 25 votes to pass it. I'm not particularly crazy about the way that Senator Swigart wants to change it. I tried that once and it didn't work.

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes, it is not a matter of Final Reading at the moment, but it is on the Final Reading. Will you restate your motion Senator Swigart.

SENATOR SWIGART: Yes, I would withdraw my motion for the time being and I think that when we get ready to move it I might make it again.
