CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays.

SPEAKER: The amendment is adopted. Further amendments on the desk? We have another amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Burbach offers an amendment to 612.

SPEAKER: Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, the bill was drafted, I forget the time, I believe it was Monday afternoon. Late Monday or late Tuesday, we had another conference of the same group that I referred to a moment ago and again the Attorney General was with us and the entire group and at the outcome of that meeting, on Page 2, we changed where it reads now "to consult and cooperate with the Adjutant General and the State Civil Defense Agency to coordinate programs and so forth". We are asking for a change and that change would then read, "to consult with the Adjutant General and the State Civil Defense Agency to coordinate under general direction and guidance". Oh, I read that wrong. "To consult with under general direction and guidance, the Adjutant General and State Civil Defense Agency to coordinate the program". Now here again is a problem where there was some concern in the original language of constitutionality. Then on Page 12, "the Adjutant General shall make such regulations that shall be necessary to carry out the purposes of this act" and, then, one other clarification in the penalty section, "Any person who fraudulently or willfully makes a misstatement of fact in connection with an application for financial assistance under this act shall upon conviction of each offense be subject to a fine of not more than \$,000 or imprisonment of not more than one year or both." This automatically would make it a felony, and by changing that and adding the word, "after imprisonment" insert "in the county jail" and then that would make that offense a misdemeanor instead of an felony. I move for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER: Is there any discussion. If not, the motion is, to adopt the amendment. All in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote no. Voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Simpson voting aye.

SPEAKER: The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays.

SPEAKER: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Correction, Mr. President. That was 28 ayes.
