PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: This amendment, if I may borrow it from the Iowa Legislature, of course, relates to parades. A great many of the performances that we have in the nature of a parade in our state now are participated in by, of all things, the Shrine Cylce Corp. I think it entirely appropriate and under a very controlled speed, a very minimal speed, a regulated situation of a parade, highly regulated, that it is entirely proper that these people be allowed, if this bill passes, these people be allowed to perform in their customary costume and this sort of thing, at this reduced speed, and I would, accordingly, recommend the adoption of this amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The question is the adoption of Senator Murphy's amendment to LB 328. Record your vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 4 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Next amendment, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I am not sure this is any longer current. It is a request by Senator Bereuter. Unanimous consent to have the contents of the machine vote on Senator Chamber's motion to kill 328 printed in the Journal. That is on top of the bill. I think that's probably already been done. Is that right? OK. Now, Mr. President, another motion to amend. To add a new section to read as follows: Read amendment. See Page 1864, Journal. Signed Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I would like the other motion first.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move to indefinitely postpone LB 328. Signed Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. President, I hope that the membership has the information that we have distributed on two or three of the issues about the safety factor and I assume we have to divide the question now. If the question is simply for federal funds, the things I am going to say or the things I would say would be of little concern to you. In my judgment, I assume that is how you are voting and that is why you are voting. I also have two amendments coming on later in case this one fails. One of those will be that a portion, a significant portion of the Highway Safety Funds will be directed to motorcycle safety, if that is the priority for the Department. So we will write that in, if that is really it. The question before us, again, and I am not going to belabor it, is that somebody has told us that we have to pass a law and that is what you are doing. I am sure everybody's mind is made up except I want to clear up some things. Senator Sullivan continues to send us information on how to vote. Yesterday, it was we couldn't put the emergency medical services into the Department of Education or we would lose funds. Day before yesterday, it was that we couldn't adopt Senator Chambers' bill of what the fine should be for going to 65 because that was what we were told we had to do. Before that, we were told that we
