SENATOR SAVAGE: There's a motion by Senator Burbach.
Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. President, I amend that motion to
include every bill that was passed on Final Reading today.

CLERK: Well he's already vetoed one of them.

SENATOR KEYES: Well then let's bring it back over.
. . . on General File today.

SENATOR SAVAGE: The amendment to your motion, Senator
Burbach, is to return all the bills that have been passed
today. Is there any discussion on this amendment?
Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, for my own information
I'd like to ask the Clerk or somebody a question. Which
bills have not been delivered thus far to the Governor,
besides 123?

CLERK: We held, pursuant to request by Senator Simpson
this morning, LB 368, 368A and pursuant to request from
Senator Burbach 123. All other bills have gone.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When did Senator Burbach first make
his request? About how long ago?

CLERK: Oh I don't know when it was Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: About 5?

SPEAKER: About 5 o'clock, when it was first ready,
before it was sent over I heard Senator . . . Lieutenant
Governor Whelan say I do sign and . . . whatever terms
are used there. Then in a few minutes after that . . .
I don't know how long but I'd say less than a half hour,
I placed that motion on the desk.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Had LB 598 been sent over there at
that time?

CLERK: No, they were companion bills, Senator, that were
read this afternoon. From here they go back to Emory
Burnett's office for enrolling and then they come back
up. There's a lot of time delay only because we have
problems breaking in to get them signed. So they set up
here shortly after Final Reading for like another hour
while we were debating one of the long bills. Then we
get them signed.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: OK, I'm trying to get something clear
in my mind now because Senator Burbach said there is an
issue of fairness here. Senator Burbach, did you vote
for or against 123?

SPEAKER: I voted against it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then what Senator Burbach is asking
for is a reconsideration. If you're not on the prevailing
side can you do that?
