CLERK: 21 ayes, 11 nays.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move we reconsider our action on failing to enact 368 into law on Final Reading on LB . . . on failing to enact 368 into law on Final Reading. Signed, Senator Dickinson. He wishes to have that laid over till tomorrow.

Mr. President, I move that the Clerk request of the Governor the return of LB 603. Signed, Senator Koch.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I withdraw that motion.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Senator Koch has asked unanimous consent to withdraw that motion. Any objections? So ordered. We still have 567 before us. Senator Anderson.

CLERK: Mr. President . . . LB 368A.

SPEAKER: . . . action by this body and we have that obligation.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 567. Read title. There are committee amendments, Mr. President, from Senator Luedtke's Judiciary Committee.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 567. There are five of them. Three of them, including number one, two, number four are all grammatical changes recommended by Director Vitek when he came before the committee to make sure that we were going to change the Good Time Law that it be mechanically feasible to do so. So we changed those. Number three changes the reduction of time from six to two days per month, which reduced, but in agreement with the committee that worked out this bill they agreed to the reduction of time which made the inmates have less time per month reduced. The last one was on a section of the statutes which was missed. Number five was a section of the statutes which was missed when the bill was being drafted.

SENATOR SAVAGE: The motion is to adopt the committee amendments. Is there any further discussion? If not, record your vote. Savage voting aye. Record.

CLERK: Senator Savage voting aye. 27 ayes, Mr. President.

SENATOR SAVAGE: The committee amendments have been adopted.
