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the two internist and the one general surgeon from our residency program who will enter practice in Grand Island this July. This is the result of the availability of the proper residency program in this state". If Kelly would open his mind, he would ask himself one question. How did he get those three residencies in his town of Grand Island if he didn't have the other residency programs which he is trying to take out of this particular bill. What he is doing is that he is taking the other residencies out of the bill the increases, and leaving only the family practice residency increases in the bill. Well if you don't want any other kind of a doctor but a general practitioner in your area, that is fine. But, if you want something more than a family practice doctor, if you want a cardiologist and if you want a bone specialist and you want a pediatrician or anything else in your district, you had better have the rest of these residencies available in the Med Center. Now, I would strongly urge you to kill, or not to adopt this amendment. Because what he is trying to do is take out the increased residency slots that are called for and that you don't want, if you want any other kinds of doctors in your area. Now let me tell you something. Senator Kelly apparently hasn't chosen to understand or completely ignores. What the medical center is asking for in this bill is a policy statement from this legislature what do you want us to do? We as Senators keep biting at them, we want doctors in the out-state area. We want doctors in Omaha, we want doctors in Lincoln, we want them all over the state. But then, frankly they come to the Legislature for appropriations and they don't get sufficient money to establish these residencies. So, consequently they are saying to us, let us put it in the book, the statute books as to just what you want us to do. This bill is a statement of policy that this legislature wants the medical center to follow in the production of doctors throughout the state of Nebraska through the residency program. Now just to refresh your minds as to what it boils down too. If we spend 50-75 thousand dollars putting a kid through four years of med school and then we do not furnish the residency programs within the state of Nebraska, they have to go out-state for the residency program, we get one out of every eight back. If we furnish the residency slot, we get 2/3 of them back. So if you want to keep doctors in the state of Nebraska, this is the way to do it, and I would strongly urge you to reject the Kelly amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, very briefly, and very, very briefly. This is just another attempt what we went through here a few days ago, various amendments to cripple the bill. I know that you know that there has been before this Legislature, Senator Goodrich had a proposal to call for a study committee which is well represented by the very same people and Senator Kelly himself and others feel that it would give us ample time because were barely seven months away from the next session that they can meet with the people at the med school and come back with a solution to the very problems that Senator Kelly has continually brought back to us each and every time he tries a different amendment. I
