PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Then Mr. President, I would like to request unanimous consent to print the following amendments to LB589. I would appreciate Mr. President to indicate that the 4th amendment I have would be to amend LB123 that was just passed. I understood that the Governor thought that he must sign it because of the mass spending that the Legislature has done. I did not read the story, it has been repeated to me that way. I want to know or for the Governor to know that there is an amendment pending to change the rates in 123 so he can feel free to use the red line as much as he feels is necessary. If he vetoes enough of the money out perhaps that increase in taxes won't be necessary.

PRESIDENT: As for the matter of bracketing, that meets with your concurrence. Senator Schmit, your light is on. About the matter of bracketing please.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I rise in support of Senator Warner's motion to bracket.

PRESIDENT: It is Senator Lewis' motion.

SENATOR SCHMIT: OK, Senator Lewis' motion to bracket because we have an abundance of amendments here obviously that need to be looked at, and I think that the last thing that we want to do now, is to adopt the amendment that has not been printed. Obviously it has not been discussed. I would support the idea.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: I was just wondering if you had any other lights on?

PRESIDENT: No yours.....OK, then the question is, alright Senator Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. President, the only comment that I would make is that I appreciate Senator Warner's request for printing his amendments in the Journal. I would do likewise and ask that we take the bill up on Monday.

PRESIDENT: The question is...

CLERK: What do you mean likewise? Your amendment? This is just another bill. There is no reason to reprint that again is there?

PRESIDENT: Question is shall this bill be bracketed until Monday. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is bracketed.
